Dear Canfield Local School District Parent/Guardian,

The Canfield Local School District is committed to the health and safety of our students and staff. We want to inform you that we have recently received information that:

- two individuals have tested positive for COVID-19 at [Canfield Village Middle School](#)
- three individuals have tested positive for COVID-19 at [Canfield High School](#)

Cleaning and disinfecting of the exposed area has been completed. We are working closely with the Mahoning County Public Health Department and anyone identified as a close contact will be notified.

Transmission of COVID-19 occurs from direct contact with respiratory discharges (coughing, sneezing, etc.) of an infected person.

Please assess your child daily for symptoms. Symptoms of COVID-19 can include fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea. If any symptoms are present, please keep your child at home and contact your child's physician if their symptoms worsen.
